Two titles from a series on women and religion. Harmony and Balance shares the personal and communal traditions of nature-based, Native American spirituality (53 min. 40 sec.). Working Towards Peace illustrates possibilities for, and difficulties with dialogue as a Palestinian and an Israeli woman struggle with the deep-rooted conflicts that separate their communities (53 min. 25 sec.). It features traditional practitioners from the Old Crow Healing Centre, the Anglican Bishop, and an Aboriginal Pentecostal pastor. It speaks of the role of residential schools in destroying and distorting Aboriginal spirituality, and the Anglican apology is included.

An elderly participant laments that young people are missing something in rejecting the church and organized religion.
